The 1931 platform building is in near original condition and retains its corrugated asbestos roof with terra-cotta ridge capping. Unlike other stations where the external surfaces have been painted, the platform building retains its face brickwork. The new footbridge superstructure is painted in a colour that does not diminish the heritage values of the original platform structure. Several members contributed to the discussion including Ian Brady, John Oakes and Whiskers McCawley. After an interesting inspection of the station, the Club members dined at the nearby Revesby Workers' Club. Members were well impressed by the quality, quantity, range and price of food and the speed of the service. The only negative aspect was the absence of draught beer in the bistro. All future luncheon venues will be measured by the high standard of the Revesby Workers' Club. Tony Bailey volunteered to be Co-ordinator of the Luncheon Club.
