RAILWAY LUNCHEON CLUB THE ROYAL NATIONAL PARK

Having ridden on Sydney's then new light rail to Dulwich Hill last year, it seemed appropriate now for the Luncheon Club to ride on Sydney's old trams. To this end on Wednesday 16 September we met at the Sydney Tram Museum at Loftus to ride in a former P Class "Toastrack" tram to The Royal National Park Station. This is actually the second Royal National Park Station. The first one was located about 200 metres further on and the track was truncated to this site in 1979. After a presentation by life member John Oakes on the history of both the former railway (now the tram route) and both stations, our return journey back to Loftus was by a newer R1 Class tram

It was all a great experience, and thanks go to John, not only for his informative presentation on the day, but for his notes which are now on the website, and for suggesting the whole event in the first place. Thanks also to Andy MacDonald and Kate Strancar for their assistance and to the staff at the Sydney Tram Museum.

Our next outing is on 21 October and we are going to Emu Plains to walk to both bridges over the Nepean River, where Bill Phippen will talk about their history and design features. We meet at Emu Plains Station at 10.09am following the arrival of the Down inter-city service which departs Central at 9.18am. Lunch will be at the Nepean Rowing Club. Note that this outing will involve considerable walking, some of quite steep grades.
