New Society Book 'To the Fertile Plains Beyond'

CC Singleton was a prolific writer of articles that found their way into the Australasian Railway and Locomotive Historical Society Bulletin (as it was then known). The railway crossing of the Blue Mountains and station arrangements of the line became the subject of numerous articles between 1939 and 1958. Many of these articles were in collaboration with RF Wylie, an invaluable source of information regarding the New South Wales Railways. Singleton adapted and updated these writings and together with his maps and station line drawings they were collated into a manuscript, including the Foreword ready for print in 1970.

Unfortunately, as a result of his death in February 1971, the project was put on hold. Contrary to Singleton's words in the Introduction and like many plans, it unfortunately never went to print and lay in limbo for many years.

In 2012 the Publications Committee recognised the need to review old manuscripts in its possession with a view to publication. The Committee recognised both the importance of Singleton's manuscript and the need to have it published as a historical record. So some 46 years later "To the Fertile Plains Beyond" will see the light of day soon in 2016.

Similarly, images of people on the outings should not be published on any non ARHS media without getting the approval of those persons involved.
